## Inside Our Doors

Over the past several months, we've enjoyed taking you on a journey inside our organization through our Spotlight Series. Each edition has highlighted a different area of our work and the dedicated people who bring our mission to life. This month, we invite you to step inside and learn more about the Board.

The St. Francois County Board for the Developmentally Disabled (SFCBDD) is dedicated to enhancing the lives of individuals with developmental disabilities through community-based programs, partnerships, and essential services. Governed by a nine-member Board appointed by the St. Francois County Commission, SFCBDD works to promote inclusion, independence, and overall well-being for individuals served throughout the county.

SFCBDD's work is rooted in Missouri Senate Bill 40, passed in 1969, which allows counties to establish boards to fund developmental disability services. In August of 1980, St. Francois County voters approved a mill tax that continues to support these vital programs. While the law has evolved over time, its purpose remains the same: to empower local communities to meet the needs of individuals with developmental disabilities.

Today, SFCBDD supports a wide range of services and initiatives, including transportation services, funding partnerships with local nonprofit organizations, and yearly community support projects such as a food pantry, gift a holiday meal, and school supply drives. The Board also supports adult Special Olympics, along with recreational and social activities that encourage socialization, enrichment, and community involvement.

As our Spotlight Series comes to an end, we have truly enjoyed sharing this journey with you and highlighting the foundational parts of our organization and the people who make our mission possible. Thank you for joining us as we celebrate the programs, passion, and commitment that shape the work we do each day.
